



Prevention:	Do not breathe mist, vapors or spray. Wash hands and any exposed skin thoroughly after handling. Wear protective gloves. Wear eye/face protection. Wear protective clothing. Keep in original or other corrosion resistant container.
Response:	IMMEDIATELY CALL A POISON CENTER OR PHYSICIAN
Eyes	IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing.
Skin	IF ON SKIN (or hair): Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin with water or shower. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.
Inhalation:	IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.
Ingestion:	IF SWALLOWED: Rinse mouth. DO NOT induce vomiting.

Spill:	Absorb spillage to prevent material damage.
Storage:	Store locked up. Store in corrosion resistant container.

Other information:	Corrosive. Harmful or fatal if swallowed / Harmful contact may not cause immediate pain. Inhalation of vapors or mist may cause respiratory irritation/damage. Take off and destroy contaminated shoes / Keep out of reach of children. Note to physician: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

In case of eye contact:	Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention.
In case of skin contact:	Take off immediately all contaminated clothing and shoes. Rinse with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Use mild soap if available. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists
Inhalation:	Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Get medical attention if symptoms occur.
If swallowed:	Rinse mouth with water. Get medical attention if symptoms occur

SECTION 5: FIREFIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable extinguishing media:	Product does not support combustion. Use extinguishing agent suitable for type of surrounding fire.
Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical:	Dried product is capable of burning. Combustion products are toxic.
Hazardous Combustion Products:	May include Carbon monoxide carbon dioxide and other toxic gases or vapors.
Protective Equipment and Precautions for Firefighters:	Wear MSHA/ NIOSH approved self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) and full protective gear. Cool fire-exposed containers with water spray.

Environmental Precautions:	Do not rinse spill onto the ground ,into storm sewers or bodies of water.
Methods for Clean-up.	Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible absorbent material,(e.g. sand, earth, diatomaceous earth) and place in container for disposal according to local/national regulations (see Section 13).
